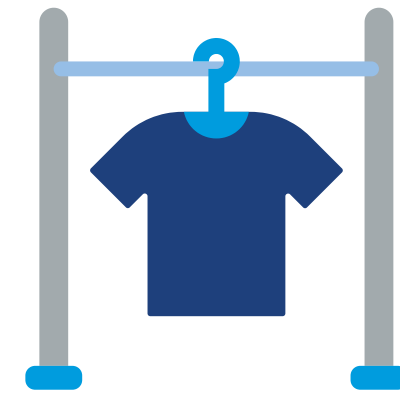

WORLDWIDE CLIMATE JUSTICE TEACH-IN

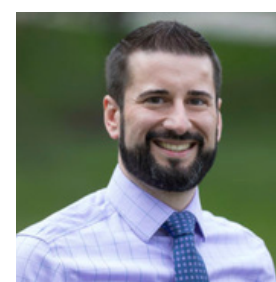
